## Dear Sisters

I am writing this letter at the end of May, after a very busy and significant period for MWiB. Apart from the usual round of meetings and speaking engagements around the Connexion, these last two months have contained some very important events and experiences.

Dr Jill Barber, Vice President of the Methodist Conference, was our speaker in April for the Swanwick weekend and we were challenged and encouraged by her keynote addresses and also by a wide range of workshops. As usual we were full to capacity as we welcomed 250 women to this annual residential event.

Jill was with us again in May at Epworth Old Rectory to open the MWiB exhibition, Transforming the World from the Kitchen, put together largely by our researcher, Sarah Braisdell. Around 80 people travelled to celebrate the culmination of this partnership – the rain held off and we were wonderfully hosted by the local team from Epworth.

Two days later 450 people gathered in Methodist Central Hall Westminster for a concert by Paul Field and Garth Hewitt to mark the culmination of 5 years supporting the Dalit people through our partnership with the Church of North India. Paul and Garth entertained us, but also challenged us to be aware of some of the very serious issues currently facing our world.

We were pleased to have two women from the Church of North India present at both of these events. Rev Meena Bhati and Ms Priya Masih have been hosted in various parts of the Connexion and have shared their stories with many of us during their visit.

In the last week of May I flew out to Greece with eleven other women from England, Wales, Ireland and Scotland to witness at first hand the situation for some of the refugees currently in that country. The visit was organised by Churches Together in Britain and Ireland and we represented nine denominations of the Christian church. We



met with paid workers and volunteers who are attempting passionately and tirelessly to bring relief and hope into that situation. We were particularly humbled by the selfless giving of so many of the Greek people, who are themselves living in austere conditions. I have already begun sharing the stories of my conversations with Syrian families, whose lives have been overturned and changed dramatically by this crisis. We continue to seek the best way, as Methodist Women in Britain, to respond to this ongoing crisis situation.

I can hardly believe that I am almost halfway through my four year commitment. This newsletter contains reflections by outgoing members of the executive, to whom I am indebted for their friendship and forbearance over the past two years. We look forward to celebrating the contribution of all outgoing Forum members at the Conference Fringe Event at Methodist Central Hall Westminster on Monday 4 July 2016 at 7pm. Louise Wilson from Ireland and Carolyn Lawrence from Britain will be commissioned as Area President and Vice President on the Friday evening, attending their first World Executive meeting on the Sunday.

# Our woman in Sri Lanka - News from a Mission Partner I am serving as a Minister with the English congregation of the Kollipitya Methodist Church in Colombo, Sri Lanka as a Mission Partner. Apart from the many varied ministries in the life of the church, I have been involved in a number of ways 'restoring lives' by walking gently alongside Christian

number of ways 'restoring lives' by walking gently alongside Christian brothers and sisters who are refugees and asylum seekers from Pakistan. This has included baptising a baby, burying a three week old baby and this week supporting a mother who had an emergency Caesarian and premature





baby. We provide a monthly Urdu service followed by lunch and fellowship. I am leading an Alpha 'restored lives' programme for those recovering from divorce and separation. This is a first in a shame - based culture to reach out to those recovering from broken relationships. The last few days I have been involved with the church collecting dry rations, water, clothes, medication etc, for flood relief victims and distributing to those in great need, as they seek to restore their lives from the disaster they have experienced. I thank God for the many ways people are restored by his grace.
