This quarter started on a very positive note with the appointment by Forum of Hilary Evans as our new Vice President. We welcome Hilary to the executive team and look forward to her commissioning as President at our Methodist Conference fringe event in Birmingham on 28th June 2019.

At the end of October 2018 we held our World Federation Study Day, based on SDG 4: Quality Education, on the same day in two venues. This proved to be very successful and we plan to build on this venture in October 2019 when we will be studying SDG 6: Safe water and Sanitation, simultaneously in Darlington and Braintree.

Other highlights of the last quarter were the opportunity for Nina Rawlins and myself to join with the Methodist Women of Ireland at their Fellowship Weekend in Newcastle County Down, an invitation from Guernsey to share fellowship with ladies in the Channel Islands, and visits to the Southampton, Manchester, Lincolnshire and the Beds Essex and Herts Districts.

Sunday 20th January 2019 marked the 350th anniversary of the birth of Susanna Wesley and many joined together in a prayer vigil at Epworth or a pilgrimage from her birthplace to burial ground in London to mark the occasion. More events are planned throughout the year so do look out for them on the Methodist Heritage and MWiB websites.

Later this year Forum will be saying goodbye to Irene Hayes, the Methodist Representative on the World Day of Prayer Committee, as she comes to the end of her three year term. Irene has brought fresh insight and energy into the role and we will miss her. 
HELEN KIM MEMORIAL SCHOLAR

The Scholarship is open to Methodist women who will be aged 18–29 at the 2021 World Assembly.

The new HKMS will travel to Gothenburg in August 2021 for two days of leadership training with other HKMS from around the world, before attending the World Assembly itself. The role is, in essence, to work alongside MWiB, encouraging the involvement of younger women in the World Federation Area, and enabling them to engage with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Rachel Allison, our current HKMS [pictured], who has been focusing on issues around FGM, forced marriage, and gender-based violence says:

"Despite the name, this is <u>not</u> an educational role leading to a formal qualification. It <u>is</u> though just a great opportunity to do and to engage with the important work of MWiB and the World Federation. There's no set role—you choose an issue to focus on, and put your own stamp on it."

In 2015 MWiB, working in partnership with Methodist Homes, produced a resource pack to encourage churches to think about ways in which our church premises and worship can be made more accessibly for people living with dementia. So, we're currently working with Methodist Homes again to update, augment and improve the information and resources, and we hope to re-launch the updated pack later this year.

Whether you've used the pack or not, we'd love to hear from you:


- ~ Why is church important for people living with dementia? In terms of both premises and worship itself:



MWiB launches new training bursaries

At the Forum meeting in February 2019, MWiB agreed to create two new bursary funds to enable women to undertake training courses currently being offered by Cliff College.

The Cliff Year

A new gap year opportunity for 18–25 year olds, running from September 2019 to July 2020, focusing on evangelism, mission and calling. A group of young Christians will live and work together in a missional community, following a simple rule of life, and exploring how to live, learn, worship, serve, and share faith together. The total all-inclusive cost for the year is £995, and MWiB is offering a 50% (variable) bursary towards this cost.



Certificate in Women in Leadership

A one-week course. Led by Dr. Joanna Williamson (One Rock International and SheLives), with members of the Cliff College faculty and others, the course is designed for those in, or aspiring to, leadership roles in both church and marketplace ministry, or those wanting to refresh their leadership toolbox and re-evaluate their current practices. The course takes place 16th–20th September 2019, and MWiB bursaries are available towards the cost £435.



Every Woman: Ruth

Working in joint partnership with Girls' Brigade Ministries, Cliff College is offering a weekend retreat for women of all ages, from 4th–6th October 2019, with space for up to 20 women to talk, pray and reflect together on the book and character of Ruth.



Places are limited on all these courses, so early booking is advised.

Our Woman in... Limbo!

Have you ever been in limbo? An interesting place: relaxed, devoid of decisions and routine, and seemingly endless. The 'ideal holiday', you might say.

Well, maybe, but it's the place I'm in at the moment as I await my return to Papua New Guinea as a mission partner. Once there I'll be returning part-time to the disaster risk reduction desk of the United Church PNG and part-time as the Methodist Church in Britain's Relationship Coordinator in the Pacific. Both roles will be based out of the capital, Port Moresby [pictured below].

This time last year, the government of Papua New Guinea had just declared a National Emergency in response to the 7.5M Highlands Earthquake, and the staff of the United Church PNG were in the throes of responding. And I was dashing around with them.

Now, I wait.

I wait for news of a visa, for a freight company collection, for flights to be arranged, for goodbyes to be said, and for warm welcomes to be made. Now, I wait.

Many people in the Bible waited on God—and some for many years. But whatever the length, there is always a reason for the 'breathing spaces' in our lives, although to us that reason may not always be obvious.

We must learn just to breathe deeply...
