Passionate Worship

At our district synod today, we heard all about passionate worship. Maybe you hear those words and think about lively music, with a worship band and arms in the air. Maybe you think of quiet, reflective worship with traditional hymns and prayers. Whatever you think of different styles of worship, at Synod we were asked to consider that passionate worship had nothing to do with the music, the style of prayers, the sermon or even how long the worship was!

Passionate worship, according to the speaker Bob Bartindale, is worship that focuses on God, bringing the awe and wonder of being in God's presence. It is also worship grounded in very real human experience, our own experiences of God in our daily lives. Passionate worship welcomes all people, is clear and accessible for all. It is also empowered by the Holy Spirit. There is an expectation that the Holy Spirit will be present, will speak and work in the lives of those gathered to worship.

There are many hymns that demonstrate this idea of reflective, passionate worship. When the Music Fades, also known as The Heart of Worship (Matt Redman), is a modern worship song which speaks of taking away the music and focusing upon the heart of worship, on God alone. A hymn that inspires that sense of awe and wonder in God's presence is Be Still for the Presence of the Lord (David Evans), which helps to prepare heart and mind for worship. Alternatively, there is To be in your Presence (Noel Richards), a hymn about personally sitting in the presence of God and how that can make us feel.
