"Connecting women in Britain with women worldwide"

As the British Unit of the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women (WFM&UCW) **MWiB** is part of a family of women around the world. This family listens to one another (through the Tree of Life international newsletter and the website www.wfmucw.org), prays for one another and occasionally gets together. Keep watching the website or newsletters as we plan for the European Seminar in Pomezia, near Rome, in June 2014 and the next world assembly in 2016 – destination unknown at time of going to press!

Vital connections with the worldwide family are also made through the World Church Relationships team, with whom we work closely. The Easter Offering service, written by **MWiB**, raises in excess of £200,000 for the World Mission Fund each year.

In 2013 the service was largely written by Julie Hulme, along with a group which included Forum member for East Anglia, Jackie Smith, who reflects on the theme, **Beyond the harbour wall**:

Dalit solidarity:

A major piece of work in this past year has been the production of a pack on Dalit Solidarity, enabling individuals, groups and churches to engage with this huge issue of global injustice. The pack is available from the Administrator, and includes information, material for meetings and services and ideas for action. Following the visit of the incoming **MWiB** President, Linda Crossley, to the Church in North India in February, we have entered into a partnership relationship with CNI, supporting them in their desire to provide education for Dalit girls and to employ more Women's Empowerment Workers.

Child domestic workers:

Our formal partnership with the small charity **Children Unite**, which works to improve the conditions and rights for the 15.5 million child domestic workers around the world, continued throughout the year. The presentation of hundreds of signed rubber gloves to the UK government



in July 2013 is a mark of our strength of support for the ratification of the ILO convention on the rights of child domestic workers. Just as rubber gloves protect our hands from harsh chemicals, so young children need to be given protection from abuse and exploitation.


MWiB operates at all levels across the British Methodist Church and beyond. It is a non-membership movement, which invites anyone interested to 'dip in'. As well as local meetings in many churches, circuits and districts, there is an annual residential weekend in April which, in 2013, took the theme of the Methodist prayer handbook, "Crossing the chasm" The conference was a sell-out, and covered a wide range of related topics including diversity in the church, women's literacy worldwide, work with prisoners and ex-offenders, how the church relates to those with learning disabilities or mental health issues and MRDF's work with Dalit women in Nepal.



Summary of Income

In 2011-12 **MWiB** received the balance of Connexional set-up grants and money was transferred in from former **Women's Network** and **WFMUCW** accounts. In future donations will be the main source of income.



Summary of Expenditure

One of the Social and Community Action Grants given in 2011-12 was £500 to the **Bethesda Kids Cafe** in Bristol, enabling them to buy equipment for a new mission opportunity with local families. See back cover for how to apply.

- MWiB operates through its Forum; 40 women from around the Connexion who come together twice a year to set policy and to pray. Find out who your district representative is from the website. There is also a small executive of 5 volunteers and a part-time paid administrator (see back page).
- MWiB is self-funding, relying on donations from individuals, churches, circuits and districts in order to operate, to cover expenses of those attending meetings, to produce resources and to engage in mission in Britain through the Social and Community Action Grants and overseas, through Empowerment Gifts.
- On behalf of the Methodist Church in Britain,

 MWiB pays a levy of 4 US cents per female

 member per year to the World Federation

 of Methodist and Uniting Church Women.

"Encouraging, equipping and enabling women to serve God in the church, the community and the world"

MWiB could be compared to a specialist health practitioner who, by focussing on the particular needs of one part of the body, contributes to the overall health of the body/church. One-day conferences in 2012-13 equipped women in different ways;

- In October 2012 in Mansfield we looked at our responses to Millennium Development Goal 7, Ensuring environmental sustainability as individual disciples and as a church. We were challenged about the urgency of this via a live Skype conversation with Julia Edwards, mission partner in Fiji, working with the Pacific Conference of Churches as they address the huge impact of climate change.
- In May 2013 in Slough, Christian artist Yvonne Bell led our thoughts in a day called **Come to us, Creative Spirit** which included lots of hands-on activities, as well as workshops in **Creative committee meetings** and **Music and audiology**.



"Leading scientists believe that our human activities are almost certainly causing the current climate change. We need to take personal action to minimise our use of resources, buy less, drive less, fly less and be more mindful of our connectedness and responsibilities to others in all that we do.

The people of the Pacific have deep faith, and many put their trust in God that he will look after their needs. But they will also take comfort from the knowledge that other people care about their situation and want to do something about it. There is always hope in action and accompaniment, we can all respond and act together."




Another thing I am excited about is the inclusion of children. Children and young people are themselves a force of creativity, with curious questions which can impact upon the life of the church."





The final words came from the Talmud: 'There are no strangers; there are only women and men who have not yet met'.

We left the service, vowing that we would in future offer kindness and friendship to any 'ladies in grey', and 'gentlemen in grey', who come into our community.

I hope that people will find 'Together in Prayer' and the children's resources useful during the rest of the year. WWDP resources are designed for use on more than one dau!


In 2014 Women's World Day of Prayer will be on Friday 7th March. The service has been written by the women of Egypt and is entitled 'Streams in the Desert'."


