

Federation Information

- Area Seminars are held every 5 years. Unit members develop new friendships and learn about activities across the world. The program includes sessions on Federation, its program emphases, its involvement in the United Nations, and local issues.
 - Current Federation issues: Health; Literacy; Ageing; Education, Discrimination; Racism; Justice; Peace; Family Life; Human Rights; Women's Rights; Children's Rights; the Girl Child; Child Labour; Violence against Women; Poverty and the Elimination of Poverty; Women and Economic Development; Women and Prostitution; Economic and Sexual Exploitation; Gender and Health, Women and AIDS; HIV/AIDS; Development; Rural Life and the Environment.
- The Units work through an Action Plan for the Millennium Development Goals.
- The *Tree of Life*, a quarterly electronic publication, brings Federation news to each member through the web-site and Facebook.
 - Federation has "special consultative status with the UN" with representatives in New York and Latin America who exercise a 'watching brief.'
 - Federation is financed through a minimum US 4¢ p.a. per member levy on Unit membership.

Introduction to World Federation



The World Federation of Methodist & Uniting Church Women (WFM&UCW), founded on 26 October, 1939, is a fellowship of officially recognized groups of Methodist, United and Uniting Church Women organized in national Units within their nations. Each affirms the Federation motto:

To know Christ and to make him known.

The logo of the Federation is the Tree of Life with its leaves for the healing of the nations (Rev. 22: 2)

The Federation aims to be a support group for women acting as a catalyst in their faith and actions; promoting the interests of women in all areas of life, in spiritual growth, equality, development and peace; working towards the equal status of women; facilitating, encouraging and actively promoting leadership training for women; and being a voice for Methodist, United and Uniting Church women.

Members in the Federation meet for an annual World Federation Day Study Program; Area Seminars preceded by Weaving Together Programs for leaders; and the World Assembly. Members delight in their fellowship across national and cultural boundaries, united in faith and common purpose.

While affiliated with the World Methodist Council, the Federation is autonomous, holding its World Assembly at a similar time to the World Methodist Conference and in the same country. At the Assembly World and Area Officers are elected for the following quinquennium. The Officers co-ordinate programs and network in sharing information.

United Nations Status

In 1983 Federation was granted its own Non-Governmental Organization representation at the UN in special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Federation is also a member of the conference of NGOs in Consultative Relationship with the UN (CONGO), Representatives attend the annual Commission on the Status of Women.

Helen Kim Memorial Scholars

Since 2001 a Leadership Training program honouring the Federation's visionary Founder, Helen Kim, has been run. Two Helen Kim Memorial Scholars (aged 18 to 30) chosen from each of the nine Units attend a 2-day program of information and training prior to the Assembly and then stay on for the entire Assembly. Units finance the program through a US\$20 p.a. contribution & gifts.

Thursdays in Black



Thursdays in Black is an international campaign uniting those who believe in respect for all human life without discrimination. The Federation has covenanted to be in solidarity with groups of women and men who have made this stand for more than 30 years. Federation women wear black each Thursday to demand a world without violence and rape in our communities.
