Letter from the Co-Chairs

Greetings!

Winter will soon be upon us, though the temperatures are remaining mild. Autumn has been quite turbulent, in more ways than one. We are experiencing the effects of climate change in the recent storms and our thoughts and prayers are with those people whose homes have been affected by flooding and erosion. The war between Israel and Palestine has shocked us as we have seen the harrowing reports on the news and prayed for peace in that war-torn land.

We have been working on the Easter Offering Service for next year, the theme of which is: 'Let Justice Roll'. God calls us to fight for justice but the need for justice is on-going and we must never give up; we need to leave a better world for the next generation and the generations after them. The resources will be available on the Methodist Publishing website after Christmas and there will be a link on our website.

We held our first Trustee Meeting in October, under our new structure. The theme of the weekend was 'Hospitality – Preparing a Table'. Being a smaller number, helped us to have useful and meaningful discussions and to review how the new structure is working. There are bound to be 'tweaks' in any new structure but hopefully we are getting there! If you are not aware of who is your Trustee, please do ask, and similarly, do contact your District Ambassadors if you have any questions – we are all here to help and to make our line of communication stronger.

This year, we are focusing on two projects: 'Period Poverty' and 'Dora' a project based in Ukraine. Our aim with 'Period Poverty' is to make sure that sanitary products are available in the cloakrooms of all churches, so please check if you have them readily available in your church and if not, raise the matter with your minister or Church Council. This is one way we can show our hospitality to those who visit our premises and to let them know they are welcome as well as providing for basic needs.

The 'Dora' project is based in sub carpathian Ukraine and has been set up to protect a group of young people (currently 19 girls and 5 boys) who are at high risk of trafficking or being unable to reach their potential because of the disruption of war. The project offers lifeskills and practical support alongside access to education. Beds Essex and Herts have already adopted this as their project for the coming year.

Ruth finishes her term of office at the end of this Methodist year, so we are advertising for a new Co-Chair. If you know anyone who you think would be suitable, please have a word with them and give them a nudge. Is God calling you? If you would like a chat about the role, please email Ruth or Maggie.

Please do continue to put your District news on our website and Facebook page so that we can share your ideas. This also helps us to know what is going on in the Districts, and strengthens communication.

As we wait for the coming of the Christ Child, who was born in occupied Judea and had to flee to safety with his parents, to Egypt, let us remember those who are having to make the same journey and for those for whom this is not an option. In this season of Advent, let us go forward in hope to pray for peace in the world.

Co-Chair Ruth's Visits

It is always a joy to visit groups and to meet you all and recently I have made three visits. The first to the Methodist Women in Ireland Retreat at the Drumalis Retreat and Conference Centre, Larne. I received a wonderful welcome and I was met at the airport by Moira, the secretary of MWI, and Joan Strong, the previous President, then transported to the Retreat Centre, where I was met by Olive Rowe, the President. Drumalis is a beautiful Centre with a very impressive staircase and colourful stained-glass windows set in splendid grounds.



The challenging theme of the conference was 'Faith Over Fear' which in the setting of Northern Ireland, had real significance for the women attending. The speaker was Rev Maureen Hassard, a Supernumary Minister who had served in Northern Ireland. She encouraged us to examine our faith in the light of two questions:

What does your faith look like to Jesus? What does your faith look like to other people?

The Methodist Connexional President of Ireland, Rev David Turtle joined us for lunch and then answered questions during the afternoon session.



This was followed by a cookery demonstration by Ingrid, who managed to demonstrate and cook seven tray bakes in an hour! There was an evening of games and quizzes. One quiz was on places in Ireland and proved to me how lacking my knowledge of Ireland is! There was much fun and laughter.

The conference concluded on the Sunday with a Communion Service led by Olive and Maureen. I was delighted to be asked to distribute the wine, which meant I had met everyone there. I came away richer than I had arrived with new friends and much to reflect upon.

My second visit was to the Dane and Trent MWiB meeting to talk about my visit to Colombia, meeting old friends and new.

I have also visited Princes Park MC in Toxteth Liverpool with Trustee Margaret Lindley. We had been invited by Naledi Phaladi, the Liverpool Ambassador, to talk about MWiB to a new group. We began with worship led by Naladi and then were given a history of the church which had served the community during the Toxteth Riots in July 1971. After a wonderful 'Bring and Share' lunch, we talked about MWiB, it's values and work and then we had a craft session – decorating candles and making bags for our Period Poverty Project. Craft work always generates conversation and we learned much about the lives of the women in Toxteth. We were royally looked after by Alfred, who, as well as looking after our needs and brewing endless cups of tea, joined in with the craft work. Thank you to the women at Princes Park, for making us so welcome and we look forward to seeing you at some of our events.



My last visit was to the annual 'Love and Light' Day for the Chester and Stoke-on-Trent District, held at Wolstanton MC, Newcastle-under-Lyme. There was a choice of activities – Christmas Card making, Glass Painting, Bible Study, Journalling, Christmas Poetry and Music workshops. It was a lovely day of fun and fellowship and we ended the day with a 'Show and Tell' Advent Service followed by tea and cake.


Easter Offering 2024—Let Justice Roll

Our work for justice is never 'done'. Let Justice Roll calls us to take a fresh stand for justice in different situations across our world.

This Easter Offering 2024 service tells stories of people standing for justice, persisting in the face of setbacks and taking up the challenge anew as circumstances change. The stories show how some people now have hope because justice has 'rolled' into their lives.

Let Justice Roll offers churches, circuits and districts a celebration of God's just purposes across the wider world.

It includes the dedication of the Easter Offering donated to the World Mission Fund of the Methodist Church in Britain, working with over 100 Partner Churches and organisations around the world.



Empowerment Gifts Update

In 2022 MWIB awarded an Empowerment Gift for a Kitchen Garden Project at Maua Methodist Hospital in Kenya, a Community Empowerment Project in Uganda and a Tailoring Project in Kenya.

And this is what they have done:

The Kitchen Garden Project has provided 32 kitchen gardens and trained and supported over 300 patients on a palliative programme on planting and growing vegetables such as kale, spinach, tomatoes, cucumber and onions and fruit trees such as mangoes, oranges and avocados, which grow well in that area. This has improved their health and wellbeing and provided financial support.

The project in Uganda empowered marginalized people, particularly disabled teenage mothers and women to help them to realise their potential and participate in community development. They conducted a community awareness workshop to sensitize communities on the needs and rights of people with disabilities so that the community can give them support even when they come up with initiatives aimed at self employment. During these awareness workshops, it was noted that the targeted communities have misconceptions about people with disabilities and they abuse them out of ignorance.

The Tailoring Project supported two workshops in Kenya, benefitting women of different ages, helping them to repair clothing and sew new items, which means they are able to buy food. They also were able to secure school uniform contracts with the local schools, which has enabled them to be more independent. Many of the women are sole breadwinners and they need the money raised to be able to feed themselves and their families. The second workshop taught the women to produce quality items including laptop cases, wrap skirts, jackets as well as school uniforms.

All last year's recipients wished to thank MWIB for their support in enabling these projects to happen and make a difference to their lives.

This year we awarded 5 Gifts: to groups in Togo for preventative health; in Fiji for training women in pastoral care leading to a recognised Level 4 qualification which will improve their lives; in Sri Lanka to provide equipment to Tamil widows to enable them to sell products and provide an income; in Columbia to provide allotments which will improve food security and financial independence and in Uganda to assist 80 vulnerable children and women with disabilities who have HIV.

All these projects will make a big difference to the quality of their lives in each of these five countries and we look forward to an update next year.
