It is just a few minutes' walk from Belfast City Hall and the main bus and train stations and only 20 minutes from George Best Belfast City Airport.

<u>TRAVEL</u>

<u>By Air:</u>

There will be people to welcome you on arrival at the Europa Buscentre or Glengall Street.

George Best Belfast City Airport (BHD) is the nearest airport to Belfast city centre. There is a designated Airport Express 600 Bus Service every 20 minutes from the front of the terminal building to the Europa Buscentre in Belfast. Tickets are available from the tourist information desk in arrivals or from the driver: a single is about £2.50 and a return is about £3.80.

Belfast International Airport (BFS) is approximately 30-40 minutes from Belfast city centre. There is a regular Airport 300 Bus Service from the bus stop located opposite the terminal exit to the Europa Buscentre in Belfast. All coaches will stop at Templepatrick and Royal Avenue in Belfast before arriving at the bus terminal. Tickets are available from the tourist information desk in arrivals or from the driver: a single is about £7.50 and a return is about £10.50.

Dublin International Airport (DUB) is about 2 hours from Belfast city centre. There is an Aircoach 705X from Dublin Airport to Glengall Street in Belfast city centre every hour from the bus stop in front of terminals 1 and 2. Tickets can be purchased from any Aircoach staff member at the Aircoach departure stands at Terminal 1 or Terminal 2 or from your driver when boarding the coach or online at www.aircoach.ie A return ticket costs approximately £20 or €24.

Friday afternoon Workshops – ... through Worship

'Praying Well' – Prayer with Louise Wilson

Louise is the Area President for Europe: Britain & Ireland and works as the Training & Development Officer for the Methodist Church in Ireland, based in its Theological College in Belfast. One of her areas of responsibility is the training of Prayer Ministry Teams in local churches and she is passionate about enabling, resourcing and releasing people in prayer.

This workshop will explore how we can deepen our experience of prayer and 'styles' of prayer by looking at: how we 'Live in the Presence of God'; how we 'Connect to the Presence of God'; and how we 'Practise the Presence of God'.

'Lift Up Your Voices' – Music with Melanie Johnston

In this workshop, we will 'lift up our voices' in song praising our God! We will sing some well-known and not so well known worship songs with a bit of a twist.
