Palm Sunday

We are nearing the fulfilment of the prophet Zechariah's words, when a Man will come and bring peace to the land, a humble King upon a donkey. We celebrate this reminder in John's gospel, that Jesus was a humble, peace bearing witness to God's love. Jesus felt love and grief for Lazarus and the sisters, and the story points to God's power and glory in even overcoming death for Lazarus, a precursor of Jesus's resurrection.

Those palm branches waved in greeting with the words 'Hosannah', would appear colourful and a welcome rustle of air in the heat. Having spent some years in Sri Lanka with my husband, David, I can vouch for the many uses of the palm tree and indeed the many types of palm...Palmyrah tall and graceful, the Talipot palm leaves used like an umbrella and in building fences and tents. Coconut oil of course and toddy, a strong intoxicant, from the Kitul tree. We lived in Jaffna, Sri Lanka when the war was still ongoing but a peace process holding tenuously. The people of Jaffna were living amongst shell damaged buildings as indeed our manse at Lockwood House was. The Methodist Church was re-building their St Peter's church, which had been flattened by a Food drop from the Indian Army. Oh how the Christians wanted their church re-built.....and indeed it was! In the midst of bombed out buildings and a desolate park, the church took shape. What a thrill to attend worship there when open!! A raising up of the same church in a new form, to serve the community. The people renewed for service.
